The Commonwealth Accessible Australia Initiative: Increasing Inclusion in Australian Communities The Australian Government is investing \$17.1 million from 2024–25 to 2027–28 to make community spaces more inclusive for people with disability. This is known as the Commonwealth Accessible Australia (Accessible Australia) initiative. Accessible Australia provides funding to enhance the accessibility of built environments and natural spaces. This includes buildings, playgrounds, beaches, and parks.

As part of this, it supports the installation of Changing Places toilet facilities.

What is the Commonwealth Accessible Australia Initiative? Accessible Australia is an Australian Government initiative designed to improve access to community spaces for Australians living with disability. This will be achieved by increasing accessible infrastructure and amenities across Australia. The Australian Government will be offering:

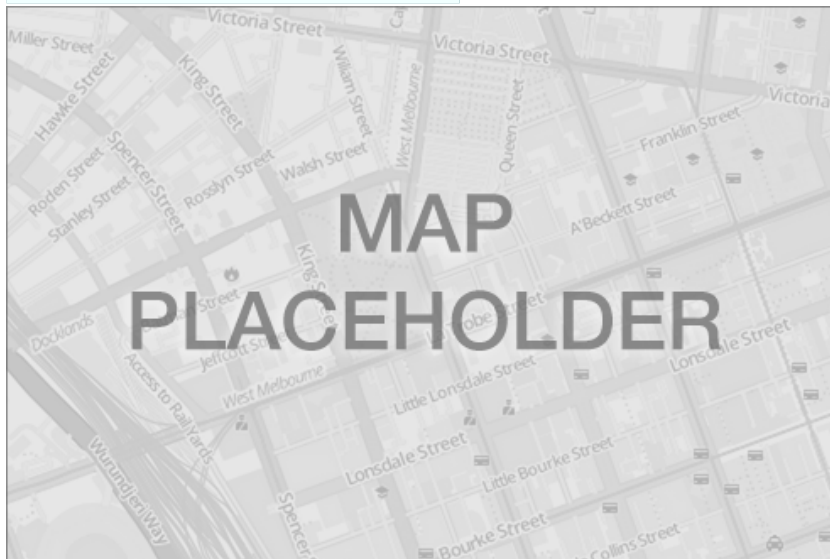

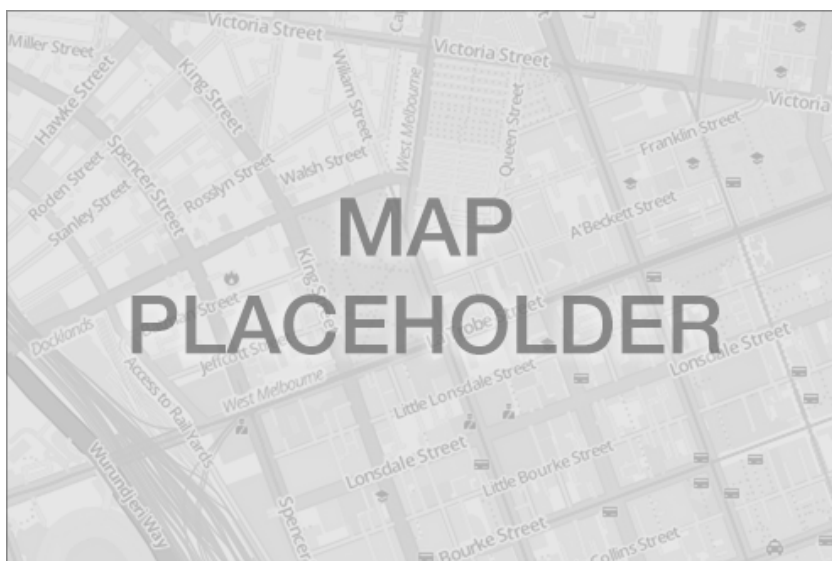

What are inclusive play spaces?

Inclusive play spaces are public areas designed for people of all ages and abilities to play together. These spaces are fixed in place, meaning they are not temporary or movable. They are built to be safe, fun, and accessible for everyone, offering a variety of play types and challenges. Inclusive play spaces may include:

- **inclusive play equipment** like liberty swings, sensory play platforms and spinners that everyone can use.
- **specialised equipment** for people with disability. This can include visual communication toys for non-speaking children or those with communication delays.

The Australian Government provides funding **up to 50 per cent** of the cost to build these play spaces (up to \$300,000 e.g. 50% Commonwealth contribution \$150,000).

Changing Places

What are Changing Places?

Changing Places are toilet facilities designed for people with high support needs who can't use standard accessible toilets. Changing Places facilities come in two types: **fixed** and **portable**. Both provide the same essential features for people with disability and their carers. This includes a height-adjustable adult change table, a hoist, and enough space for a wheelchair and two carers.

- **Fixed Changing Places** are permanent facilities. They can be built as standalone buildings or included within larger public spaces.
- **Portable Changing Places** are mobile versions, such as Placeable Pods or Marveloos. They are ideal for locations where building a permanent facility isn't possible or practical.

Whether fixed or portable, both types offer the full Changing Places experience, just in different formats.

The Australian Government provides funding to help cover building costs **up to**:

- **50 per cent** of the cost for fixed Changing Places facilities (up to \$250,000 e.g. *Commonwealth contribution \$125,000*)
- **100 per cent** of the cost for portable Changing Places facilities (up to \$200,000).

1. Engage an Assessor

All Changing Places must be accredited by a [Changing Places assessor](#). Accreditation ensures that Changing Places are built to standard, ensuring users can be confident that design is fit for purpose.

2. Choose your Design

Facilities must meet the [Changing Places Design Specifications 2020](#), which can be downloaded from the [Changing Places](#) website.

3. Get Accredited

All permanent and portable facilities must be accredited by a Changing Places Assessor.

Once a Changing Places Assessor has assessed a facility and is satisfied it meets the requirements of the Changing Places Design Specification 2020, a Statement of Compliance will be issued. The funding recipient must provide a copy of the Statement of Compliance to DSS

4. Register your facility

5. Promote your Changing Places

Recipients must ensure that once the Changing Places facility is accredited, it is listed on the [National Public Toilet Map](#). Please note this is not required for portable facilities whose location will depend on need.

Inclusive beaches are beaches that are made easier to access for people with disability and their carers. This means everyone, no matter their age or ability, can enjoy Australia's beaches. Portable equipment to help make beaches more inclusive may include:

- **beach wheelchairs:** wheelchairs that can move over sand, mud, gravel or uneven ground.
- **floating wheelchairs:** wheelchairs that let people safely float in the water while sitting in the chair.
- **accessible beach matting:** a roll-out mat that creates a firm path over the sand, making it easier for people who use wheelchairs or with limited mobility to get to the beach.

What are inclusive national parks?

Inclusive national parks are parks that are made easier to access for people with disability and their carers. This means everyone, no matter their age or ability, can enjoy Australia's national parks. Portable equipment to help make national parks more inclusive may include:

- **all-terrain wheelchairs:** wheelchairs that can go on rough walking tracks. They often have adjustable seats and supports. They work for both adults and children with different needs.
- **portable accessible paths:** these are temporary paths that can be placed on rough ground like gravel. They make it easier for people using wheelchairs to move around outdoors.
